## New building freezer hall

At the end of next month (July 2019) we will finish the new freezer hall with approx. 4,000 m<sup>2</sup> in Schiffdorf. This deep-frozen warehouse offers approximately 4,400 pallet spaces and has been built to the latest standard.

This means, among other things, that the cooling unit is not operated with conventional refrigerants, but we operate this with Co2. Furthermore, heat recovery in the freezer hall uses the waste heat generated by the chillers to operate the heating in that deposit.

Likewise, investments were made in a photovoltaic system. This generated energy is used exclusively for own use. In addition, the system has been designed to ideally handle 2/3 of the building's power, including the cooling system.

Furthermore, the access routes (and associated transport energies) between the existing, still existing cold storage warehouse in Bremerhaven and our main building in Schiffdorf will be eliminated and thus less pollutant emissions will be released to the environment.

All our trucks are equipped to the latest standard (Euro 6). With this standard we are able to be more ecologically sustainable in order to reduce emissions and fuel consumption.

## **Avoiding plastic**

Of course, we also want to convert our products to greener materials in the best possible way. Several discussions have already been held with our suppliers and even some alternatives in the disposable sector have already been changed.

Likewise, we continue to work on replacing other articles with alternatives. Talk to us.
